Financial pressures

As many of you may have seen in the news, schools and early years settings across the country are currently facing increasing financial pressures. Like many others, Arlesdene Nursery School and Preschool is working hard to continue providing high-quality care and education, despite rising costs and limited funding.

We want to reassure you that we are doing everything we can to manage our budget responsibly and maintain the nurturing, resource-rich environment your children deserve. However, as part of our community, you can help in small but meaningful ways.

Can You Help With Everyday Essentials?

We use a range of simple consumable items in our daily activities – especially for sensory play, playdough and creative activities. Donations of the following items would be hugely appreciated:

- Plain flour
- Tissues
- Table salt
- Baby wipes
- Baby oil
- Pasta
- Cornflour
- Rice
- Own brand cereals
- Hand wash

Even just one or two items per family can help to reduce our weekly shopping bills. We are continuously grateful for the support that you show us.

Gentle Reminders

Screen time

We understand we are living in a world of growing technology yet please ensure that your child has access only to TV shows and films that are appropriate for their age.

Please ensure YouTube settings are set for their correct age and if you are unsure or would like help please speak to your child's key person.

Internetmatters.org has 5 top tips

- Set rules on the use of screens in and out of the home
- 2. Make play, family time and sleep a priority over screens
- 3. Play, watch and discover together
- 4. Take the lead when choosing what they see and do on screens
- 5. Set a good example with your own screen use

How to recognise when screen time is 'too much'

Often a sign that a child is spending too much time on screens is when they may feel anxiety or stress if they are disconnected or separated from their phone. Lack of sleep and exercise and no willingness to visit friends may be a sign they need to take a break from their device

Appropriate shoes

Now that it is getting warmer please make sure that you have applied sun cream to your child and if they stay all day, leave a named bottle here.

Please make sure your child has suitable footwear for the summer, please no open toe sandals or jelly shoes, trainers only.





Arrival times

Please remember our start times across the school, we are seeing an increasing number of children arriving late and being collected early. This is really distracting for the children, as not only are they missing crucial learning at group times which take place at the beginning and end of sessions, it is also disruptive to the other children. Please arrange early collections with the office for pre-agreed appointments only.



Climate action plan

All schools are expected to have a Climate Action Plan in place by the end of 2025. We have been working with a Government funded company 'Let's go Zero' to make ours. The school have also appointed a climate ambassador and this is our Senior Early Years Practitioner—Himashi.
